### The Parable of the Sower

In this study, we are presenting the ways Holy Ghost inspires by enlightenment as He demonstrates the principles of the Gift of Interpretation.

As a beginning, we share this passage:

Psalm 78:2

I will open my mouth in a parable [to instruct using examples];  
I will utter dark and puzzling sayings of old [that contain important truth]—  
[Note the principles of the Kingdom in which Jesus practiced:

1. Parables of the natural or physical to use as example in speaking.  
In most situations, methods of communication are speaking, or writing.
2. Using “sayings” about something familiar to the hearer, yet, not exposing the meaning.

Jesus demonstrates this “pattern” of using parables and dark sayings. He tells us why He chooses to do so as He is confronted by apostate Jewish religious leaders.

Matthew 13:13 (AMP)

This is the reason I speak to the crowds in parables:  
because while [having the power of] seeing they do not see,  
and while [having the power of] hearing they do not hear,  
nor do they understand and grasp [spiritual things].

We are presenting (3) examples released as Holy Ghost reveals the meaning of a parable (a “dark saying) involving the ‘sower of seeds and the kinds of “soil” in which they are to grow.

Matthew 13:18-23 (AMP) The Sower Explained

18 “Listen then to the [meaning of the] parable of the sower:

19 When anyone hears the word of the kingdom [regarding salvation] and does not understand and grasp it, the evil one comes and snatches away what was sown in his heart.

This is the one on whom seed was sown beside the road.

20 The one on whom seed was sown on rocky ground, this is the one who hears the word and at once welcomes it with joy;

21 yet he has no [substantial] root in himself, but is only temporary, and when pressure or persecution comes because of the word, immediately he stumbles and falls away [abandoning the One who is the source of salvation].

22 And the one on whom seed was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the worries and distractions of the world and the deceitfulness [the superficial pleasures and delight] of riches choke the word, and it yields no fruit.

23 And the one on whom seed was sown on the good soil, this is the one who hears the word and understands and grasps it; he indeed bears fruit and yields, some a hundred times [as much as was sown], some sixty [times as much], and some thirty.”

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Mark 4:13-20 (AMP) Explanation of Parable of the Sower

13 Then He said to them, "Do you not understand this parable?

How will you understand and grasp the meaning of all the parables?

14 The sower sows the word [of God, the good news regarding the way of salvation].

15 These [in the first group] are the ones along the road where the word is sown; but when they hear, Satan immediately comes and takes away the word which has been sown in them.

16 In a similar way these [in the second group] are the ones on whom seed was sown on rocky ground, who, when they hear the word, immediately receive it with joy [but accept it only superficially];

17 and they have no real root in themselves, so they endure only for a little while; then, when trouble or persecution comes because of the word, immediately they [are offended and displeased at being associated with Me and] stumble and fall away.

18 And others are the ones on whom seed was sown among the thorns; these are the ones who have heard the word,

19 but the worries and cares of the world [the distractions of this age with its worldly pleasures], and the deceitfulness [and the false security or glamour] of wealth [or fame], and the passionate desires for all the other things creep in and choke out the word, and it becomes unfruitful.

20 And those [in the last group] are the ones on whom seed was sown on the good soil; and they hear the word [of God, the good news regarding the way of salvation] and accept it and bear fruit—thirty, sixty, and a hundred times as much [as was sown]."

The Parable of the Sower - "The Heart of Life"

Imagine the moment God designed the Human Heart!

He created all things and He made man in His "image" and "likeness"

First the Natural... then... the Spiritual.

1 Corinthians 15:46-47 (AMP)

46 However, the spiritual [the immortal life] is not first, but the physical [the mortal life]; then the spiritual.

47 The first man [Adam] is from the earth, earthy [made of dust]; the second Man [Christ, the Lord] is from heaven.

In the natural (physical) creation and the spiritual creation,

God demonstrates His sovereign existence!

God is the Source of All things. God is spirit and truth.

He also created Cultural things and Numerical things.

The integer (4) symbolizes His Will and His Ways. He is specific!

The human heart contains four (4) Chambers with specific functions.

Two chambers send refreshed "Life Giving" blood to the body.

Two chambers return blood depleted of life substances to the heart for restoration.

Physically, blood is Life Sustaining and reenergizes the body.

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Spiritually, Life Now and Eternal is in the sacrificed Blood of Jesus!  
This Blood of God restores and regenerates the spirit and soul!

There is healing provided in this sacred spiritual blood! The Blood is the Spirit of God!

The Holy Spirit gives Life to an individual's spirit and soul in the  
"Plan" of the vertical and horizontal structure of the Cross of Calvary!  
[Note: Vertical: relationship with the Trinity...Horizontal: relationship man to man.]

The Word of God (the Life giving Blood of the Spirit gives hope, faith and love to man's  
destitute soul.

Father God through His Son gives a spiritual message about the Heart in a multitude  
of Ways! This message is of (4) parts. It demonstrates the physical and spiritual!

WITH ALL YOU HAVE GOTTEN, GET UNDERSTANDING,  
DISCERNMENT, COMPREHENSION AND ACCURATE INTERPRETATION

The 3<sup>rd</sup> example: The Parable of the Sower illustrates the importance of the "follow"  
through. Only one fourth of the soil was ready for the Seed,  
so only one fourth brought forth fruit. As man is 3-fold made a body, soul and spirit,  
we "see" (3) required parts to effectively bring forth fruit in our "parable" interpretation.

1. The Sower is the Witness.
2. The Seed is the Word of God.
3. The Soil is the Heart.

There are four types of Hearts:

- The Hard Heart: This is the wayside soil; Fertile but Hard.
- The Shallow Heart: This is Stony soil; Fertile but Depthless.
- The Worldly Heart: This is Thorny soil; Fertile but Possessed.
- The Understanding Heart: This is Good soil; Fertile and Prepared.

If we expect the Seed, The Word of God, to bear fruit and sustain Life within us,  
the Heart must be made ready: We must receive and rely in the "Blood," the Holy Spirit.

- The Hard Heart must be Broken.
- The Shallow Heart must be given Depth.
- The Worldly Heart must be Taught.
- The things of this world must be seen as Temporal.

We focus on the things unseen... (the sustainer of our faith).

When God gives Vision, He gives the Provision necessary to accomplish it.

Potential is not determined by us, but by the demands made upon it.

Ability is determined by demand.

The Heart is the Central essence for the body both in our physical realm  
and the Body of Christ! It directly effects Large, Medium, Small and Minute vessels.
